- 32 Hour Asbestos Worker
- Mold Remediation, and
- Lead Remediation



LVI also has qualified environmental and engineering professionals on staff who are also available to provide support for your projects, including:

- Phase I, II and higher ESA's
- Building Demolition Inspection
- Hydrology and Field Equipment O&M
- Surface Water Sampling and Monitoring
- Community Outreach and Data Gathering
- Brownfield Site Assessment and Remediation, and
- Staff Technical Training



This Program is truly unique because participants are trained by our staff of environmental engineers, geologists and scientists who have first hand knowledge of the needs of the environmental industry. After completion of the training, we assist our students with job placement through our network of corporate partners. LVI then tracks and monitors their performance for a two-year period.

It was established in Louisiana, post-Katrina, with a mission to train and educate inner-city youth to become stewards of their environment while introducing them to entry-level career opportunities in environmental science and engineering. The Premise is that "The greatest opportunity coincides with the greatest need."

We realize that the infrastructure repair and environmental restoration needs are greatest in poor communities, so we think that the most effected individuals should have a true opportunity to benefit economically from that need. We also realize that environmental restoration in the Gulf Coast will be an on-going effort for years to come. We want inner-city youth to be aware of this need and benefit from this opportunity.



COMMUNITY PARTNERS

BFA Barnes, Ferland and Associates (BFA) is an environmental and scientific consulting firm, established in 1994 to help meet the growing need for environmental consultants. In collaboration with LVI, BFA provides senior registered professional engineers, geologists and other scientists to function as LVI instructors.

BDR Beck Disaster Recovery (BDR) has provided both service learning opportunities and actual employment to LVI graduates as part of BDR's commitment to rebuild New Orleans.

NHS We partnered with Neighborhood Housing Services to conduct property surveys of Uptown and Central City. They've also provided our corpsmembers team-building and anger-management training.

BOH Beacon of Hope and the University of New Orleans partnered with us to conduct a property survey of the Lakeview and Gentilly neighborhoods. The information collected will be sent to the City's Department of Recovery to provide the city with much needed census and property data.

LSU AgCenter The LSU AgCenter has provided us with connections to the Wetlands Restoration efforts currently in place at City Park's Pelican Greenhouse as well as the New Orleans Food and Farm Network.

YEP Through the Youth Empowerment Project's NO-PLAY program, we are able to provide our corpsmembers with the opportunity to obtain their GED through intensive, personalized instruction designed to meet the individual learning needs of each student.

LIUNA Laborers International Union of North America and the New Orleans Worker Resource Center have offered graduates craft apprenticeships. LVI corpsmembers can transition to one of several 1-5 year trade-skill journeyman programs. LIUNA, under the WRTP-DOL Grant, provides additional technical training for our participants during our 4 month program cycle.

CSO The City of New Orleans' Division of Environmental Health is currently creating an Environmental Field Inspector Internship Program, to provide an opportunity for LVI participants to prepare for Civil Service opportunities as City Inspectors.
